SOFTWARE REQUESTS

Are you are teaching a class in Fall 2022 and using a campus classroom or computer lab on the North Campus or Highlands College? If so, and you need any software besides Microsoft Office, Adobe Reader, Firefox, Chrome, and VLC media player, please submit a TECH SUPPORT ticket

(https://mtech.teamdynamix.com/TDClient/1921/Portal/Requests/ServiceDet?ID=36966) **BEFORE May 11** to request your software. Computers are reimaged each summer, therefore just because the software was previously installed does not mean it will be there in the Fall – UNLESS you request it. If your request is not submitted **BEFORE May 11**, your software may not be installed when the semester begins.

Why do I need to have my request in so early?

- The amount and type of software required may not run on the computer that is currently installed in the lab/classroom you are scheduled to use. If the lab/classroom you are intending to use does not have the specifications required, other arrangements need to be made.
- Podium computers in classrooms and computers in computer labs are re-imaged (rebuilt) every summer. This takes time and coordination. Not getting your software request in on time impacts our schedule significantly.
- Submitting a late software request may require computer support to put in overtime.
 This is not only expensive, but also does not guarantee that your software will be installed when you need it to be.
