25Live is an integrated academic and events scheduling software used by academic students, faculty, and staff to create and maintain one-time, recurring, or special events by submitting a request. Examples include meetings, presentations, training, research seminars, study jams, demonstrations, and workshops. 25Live enables authorized faculty users to review requests, make changes and corrections, and finally approve or deny requests. Classes take precedence over events so this means that if a class should need

the location you have reserved, your event will be cancelled. It is important to remember that when you are requesting changes to a class schedule that you email enrollment@mtech.edu. This will ensure your request is processed and secured through Banner and automatically updated in 25Live. In order to schedule an event you would like displayed on the webpage and MyMTech, be sure to select the correct calendar option. RESPONSIBLE CONDUCT OF RESEARCH TRAINING (RCR)

TIKTOK DIRECTIVE

The Office of the Commissioner of Higher Education directs the following:

1. TikTok may not be installed or used on any MUS or university-owned devices, including but not limited to desktop computers, laptops, iPads, or cellular telephones. If TikTok is currently installed on any MUS or university-owned device, the application must be immediately removed from the device.
2. Campus Chief Information Officers (CIOs) shall block access to TikTok on MUS wired and wireless networks.
3. University-administered TikTok accounts must be suspended.
4. Campuses may provide exceptions to this directive for necessary education or research-related purposes upon approval of the campus CIO.

SERVICE ANIMALS

A reminder to all faculty and staff that a service animal (dog or miniature horse) is allowed anywhere on campus, including labs, common spaces, and the residence halls, so long as

it is with the student who owns it, and the area is not dangerous to the animal. Faculty and staff may only ask students with service animals two questions:

1. Is the dog a service animal required because of a disability?
2. What work or task has the dog been trained to perform?

The only time a service animal may be removed from an area is if it is causing major disruptions (ex. destroying property, uncontrollable behavior) or posing a direct threat of physical harm. Faculty and staff may not request the student present documentation for the animal, nor ask the student to have the animal perform the work or tasks it has been trained to do. Service animals are different from assistance/emotional support animals. It is ILLEGAL in the state of Montana for someone to pretend their assistance animal is a service animal. TESTING

The Academic Center for Excellence (ACE) offers a testing center for accommodated and makeup exams and placement tests. Our operating hours are Monday-Friday from 9:00 am-5:00 pm. If you would like to schedule a student to take an exam at ACE, please fill out the **Test Request Form** at least three days in advance. For faculty who have used the Test Request Form before, use this new link instead of the old one, which is no longer accessible.

WIRELESS CHANGES

There have been changes to the campus wireless over the winter break. The following is a breakdown of the new names and when to use each wireless network as well as solutions to common issues. Some of the wireless names appear to be the same as they were before the break but due to the upgraded hardware, they have actually all been rebuilt - reconnecting to them may be required.

- **MT-Campus-Laptops (previously MTPodium):** This wireless network is for Montana Tech owned laptops and will not be accessible from a personal mobile device. If you have a campus laptop that will not connect to this network, restart it and it should auto-connect from there.
- **MTDorms:** Best used for student owned devices located in the dorms that won't be carried around campus. It does require an mtech.edu login to function.
- **MTGuest :** The guest network for campus visitors that do not have an mtech.edu account.
- **eduroam:** The wireless network shared among all Montana University System campuses. This will be the primary network for personal laptops in classrooms, personal mobile devices, etc. It does also require an mtech.edu account to login.

Known issues and workarounds:

1. **eduroam:** Due to the hardware change mentioned above, even if you had the *eduroam* network on your devices previously, you may need to “Forget” the network and then sign in again.
2. **Account Lock out:**
 1. If you type in your mtech.edu password incorrectly while connecting and let the device attempt to reconnect over and over, it will lock your account out. Accounts will unlock automatically after 30 minutes of no logins, this means you will need to forget the *eduroam* or *MTDorms* network or disconnect your WiFi for 30 minutes before trying again with the correct password. If you change your password – please shut off your phones and laptops, change the password on the desktop and then turn on one device at a time, updating your passwords as you turn them on to prevent lock out.
 2. If you attempt to log in to any service that requires your mtech.edu credentials (i.e. your desktop, my.mtech.edu, etc) and have 5 failed log in attempts your account will also lock for 30 minutes.
