## PUBLIC LECTURE SERIES

Montana Tech's Public Lecture Series will host Dr. W. J. "Jim" Lewis, Professor of Mathematics and Chair of the Department of Mathematics at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln on **October 5, 2022 at 4:00 pm** in the Montana Tech Library Auditorium. His presentation is titled, "STEM Education & the Role of the Mathematics Department: Nebraska's Story & Opportunities Supported by the National Science Foundation."

Jim Lewis, PhD, is the Aaron Douglas Professor of Mathematics at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln where he has served as chair of the Department of Mathematics and Director of the Center for Science, Mathematics and Computer Education and Director of STEM Education Research Initiatives. From 2015 to 2018 he worked at the National Science Foundation, serving first as Deputy Assistant Director and then as Acting Assistant Director for the Education and Human Resources Directorate.
