MONDAK PUBLIC LECTURE SERIES

You are invited to the next MonDak Public Lecture on **Friday, February 2**,

2024 from 11:00 am – 12:00 pm presented by Jim Gebhardt, PhD, PE., Section Editor-in-Chief for Mineral & Metallurgical Processing for SME's technical journal *Mining, Metallurgy & Exploration*. His presentation is titled, Historical Perspective of the U.S. Bureau of Mines and its Impact on the Current Minerals Crisis. Jim Gebhardt graduated with a B.S. in Metallurgical Engineering from South Dakota School of Mines and Technology and MS and Ph.D. degrees in Minerals Engineering from the University of California, Berkeley. He then joined the U. S. Bureau of Mines at Avondale, MD, and moved to the Bureau's Salt Lake City Research Center when the Bureau closed the Avondale facility. In between, he spent one year at the Mineral Processing Laboratory of the Italian National Research Council, in Rome, Italy. Jim joined the private industry sector in 1991 with Control International, Inc. in Salt Lake City as a senior engineer and group leader. In 1996, he co-founded Process Engineering Resources Inc. with four partners, where they developed the PERI PX-2100 X-Ray Fluorescence elemental analyzer, automatic ball charging equipment and software & simulation technology. In 2012, FLSmidth purchased PERI and Jim joined the Automation Division as a technical specialist. He moved to the FLSmidth Mining R&D group in 2019 providing technical support for the comminution and flotation research portfolios and retired from FLS in 2022. Jim is a Registered Professional Engineer and has been an active member of SME (Society for Mining, Metallurgy & Exploration) since 1976. He is the current Section Editor-in-Chief for Mineral & Metallurgical Processing for SME's technical journal Mining, Metallurgy & Exploration.

DRIVER SAFETY FOR CAMPUSES

You are invited to attend a two-hour Driver Safety Course full of information on driving a large vehicle with occupants or gear for the university system. The course is designed to educate drivers on operating a wide variety of vehicles for MUS campuses. It expands coverage of defensive driving tips applicable to all motor vehicles while retaining information about the special techniques needed to safely drive the full-size sport utility vehicles and small buses still used by campuses. It also explains Board of Regents' driving policies and the stricter policies set by some campuses. ATTENTION ZOOM USERS

The minimum version is 5.14.5. The current

version is 5.17.0. If you click on the icon for Zoom on your desktop, it will tell you what version you currently have at the bottom. If you need to update, then try downloading the Zoom Desktop Client from the download center: <https://zoom.us/download>. If that doesn't work, you might have to go to your control panel, program and features, and uninstall the old version of Zoom. Then you can try to install the updated version.
